From The Pastor's Desk:

BE QUICK TO DO GOOD!

"Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to do it. Do not say to your neighbor, "Go, and come again, tomorrow I will give it" -when you have it with you." Proverbs 3: 27, 28

God's wisdom for everyday living, God's wisdom for life-giving relationships says that we should have a quick trigger when it comes to doing good to others. Ray Ortland captures the heart of this verse when he says, "We sin against each other not only by the bad things we do, but also by the beautiful things we withhold."

When we have the power to do good to someone and withhold it, we sin against them and God. God made us in His image, which means, according to this verse, He made us to love others by doing good to them. When we are quick to do good, it has the effect of breathing God's life into our relationships. However, the opposite is also true, when we withhold love, it literally sucks the life right out of our relationships. Withheld love is life deflating and life depleting.

Because of our sinful nature, sometimes it's really hard to do good to others. So often we feel the power of our selfishness closing our hearts to others. It can become so easy to just do nothing...to withhold good.

But there is good news! The life-giving power of Jesus in the Gospel is able to open our hearts to do good. If you are in a place where it is difficult to do good, you must look to Jesus. Meditate on who He is for you in these verses:

Romans 8:32

"He did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?"

II Corinthians 8:9

"For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich."

II Peter 1:3

"His divine power has granted us ALL THINGS that pertain to life (eternal) and godliness through the knowledge of him who called us to his own glory and excellence."

Psalm 84:11

"No good thing does he withhold from those who walk uprightly."

In other words, if we abide in Jesus and His words abide in us, He will produce in us a heart that will be quick to do good.

Junior Children's Church


Each of our children's ministries exists for the purpose of:

Suburban Mothers' Day Out







Most child experts agree that giving children responsibilities, even those as young as toddlers and preschoolers, is beneficial for a variety of reasons, from helping parents handle the burdens of a household to creating responsible young adults.

A consistent system of chores teaches responsibility and organization. Chores boost children's self-confidence, because they find a sense of accomplishment when completing their obligations, and families connect when everyone feels like a valuable contributor.

Give young children simple tasks. Children as young as two can be given household chores, such as helping take clothes out of the dryer, putting their clothes away, cleaning up after a meal by throwing away the paper napkins or wiping tables or counters. Keep expectations realistic when children are very young or chores are new: the goal is establishing the routine and teaching kids' responsibilities, rather than how clean the table is or how neatly folded their clothes are. Use chore calendars & reward systems. Calendars and chore charts are not only good organizational systems but can also be used to help reinforce language and math skills for children. Chores are great life skills for children. Andrea Hoover

Men's Breakfast & Bible Study

The Saturday Morning Men's Prayer Breakfast, which meets on the first and third Saturdays of the month, will meet on October 5th and October 19th. The in-depth study and discussion of the **Book of Acts** (chapter by chapter, verse by verse, word by word) will continue with comprehensive studies of **Chapter 14** and **Chapter 15**.

In last month's sessions, the Holy Spirit continued the expansion of the Gospel by sending Barnabas and Paul from Antioch in Syria to Cyprus and into Asia Minor. After traveling through several cities in Pamphylia and Pisidia and preaching in their synagogues, they were rejected by the local Jewish Leadership who stirred up persecution against them and drove them from their district.



Barnabas and Saul then took their message to the Gentiles and "shook off the dust from their feet against them (the Jewish leaders) and went to Iconium" (modern Turkey) (Acts 13:51).

In **Chapter 14**, the continuation of what is known as "**Paul's First Missionary Journey**" will be discussed. To be considered will be the fact that while the number of believers increased, and miracles were performed; Jewish opposition to Paul and Barnabas continued. In Lystra, Paul was stoned and left for dead.

In **Chapter 15**, there will be a description of the conflicts within the church created by those who insisted that followers needed to be circumcised, "the party of the Pharisees rose up and said, 'It is necessary to circumcise them and to order them to keep the law of Moses'" (Acts 15:1). What followed was the **Jerusalem Council** and decisions that opened the way for the Gospel to be freely taught to Gentiles. After that, Paul and Barnabas separated.

The Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study is an outstanding opportunity for bible study, prayer, and fellowship. It is open to all men, church members and non-members. Breakfast begins at 8:00 am concludes no later than 10:00 am.


Belong Ladies Ministry

What happens on Sunday Mornings?



THE GOSPEL IS COMING TO THE SAHARA! GCRI Fall 2019 Project

Great Commission Resources International provides resources to meet the needs of indigenous Christian workers in poor, remote & persecuted areas of the world. Ed White is the founder and meets with Pastor Todd on a regular basis to let us know what our support is accomplishing around the world. The GCRI Fall 2019 Project is underway with the goal of raising \$56,000.00 to open the school doors for the Berber people.

The Berber people group, inhabiting the northern Sahara, has yet to hear of the Savior. Some of them live in villages on the margins of the desert; others dwell in tents further in the desert. Most are illiterate and desperately poor. God has placed this unreached group on the heart of a nearby indigenous ministry. The ministry asked the Berbers what would most help lift them out of poverty. They replied, "A school!"

This conversation was the start of the vision that has led to GCRI's fall project. The plan is to first provide a school in a village on the northern edge of the desert. Teaching them to read and write would provide an opportunity for employment in the northern cities. Most importantly, they will know that Christians are funding and staffing the school. We ask that you pray they will invite the Christian staff into their homes for tea and hear the gospel.







Ministry Update



One of the ministries that Suburban supports every month is the Judeo-Christian Outreach Center. Their mission is "To empower homeless families and individuals to recover from crisis situations and return to being self-supporting, productive, and independent members of our community."

One of their objectives is to feed our homeless residents and neighbors a good, wholesome meal once a day. That totals more than 85,000 free meals annually to both residents and non-residents at a cost of approximately \$2.00 per meal. Everyone in the community is welcome to join them for dinner, homeless or not.

The Community Dinner is served Monday-Friday at 6:00 pm and Saturday-Sunday and all major holidays at 3:00 pm. Their Community Breakfast is served Saturdays at 8:00 am. JCOC is able to offer these meals 365 days a year due to the more than 100 volunteer organizations that provide, prepare and serve the food. Each of these organizations takes great pride in their food preparation and prepares meals with as much care as they would at home for their loved ones.

Every Fall, the JOCC holds their Annual Sign-Up Dinner, where all of the participating organizations pick their dates for serving the meal for the following year. Our church has signed up to provide one of these meals on Friday, October 4th. If you are looking for a way to serve our community and would like to volunteer, please contact Betty Owens. We are planning on serving chili, salad, rolls, and cookies. If you would like to help provide some of the items for the meal, please sign up on the sheets available in the adult Sunday School classes.
