FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK: F.R.O.G. - 2 Chronicles 16:7-9

Wendy (my amazing wife) was an elementary school teacher for 25 years! She taught every grade, 1st through 6th, but the majority of those 25 years she taught third grade. As every schoolteacher knows, there is a lot that goes into getting ready for a new school year. One of the big things that teachers have to do every year, is decorate their classroom in a way that captures a child's imagination but also communicates a clear message.

Every year in her classroom, I remember there being a bulletin board with a beautiful frog that she had painted (it was huge). And next to the frog was the acrostic: Fully Rely On God. I asked her, what led her to the FROG theme and her response was, "It's the only way I could get through the year." She also wanted to communicate colorfully and clearly to each child in her class that the only way they could get through the year was to Fully Rely On God.

This past week, I was reading about King Asa in 2 Chronicles 14-16. In these chapters, the theme of relying on God is mentioned repeatedly. I'd like to point out a few observations from Asa, of what it means to **Fully Rely On God**.

8:30 am SCC Fellowship Hall It is not possible to fully rely on God apart from prayer. The very act of prayer communicates to God that we need him and apart from him we can do nothing. In 2 Chronicles 14, Zerah the Ethiopian leads his army of over a million men against King Asa. Asa is outnumbered almost two-to-one. Listen to what Asa does in 2 Chronicles 14:11, and Asa cried to the Lord his God, "O Lord, there is none like you to help...Help us, O Lord our God, for we **RELY** on you, and in your name we have come against this multitude. O Lord, you are God; let not man prevail against you."

As a understood that the only way to victory was to fully rely on God. As I write this article, as a church, we are in the middle of our Week of Prayer... (What a blessing!). We also have completed 1 year of our Saturday evening prayer time...(such a sweet hour of prayer). I am convinced, that the victories we are seeking, the revival we are longing for, will only come as we fully rely on God in prayer.

To fully rely on God in prayer means that prayer must precede any type of decision or action on our part. In chapter 16 when Asa is confronted with opposition from King Baasha, instead of fully relying upon God in prayer, Asa takes matters in his own hands. He decides to form an alliance with the king of Syria. He sends silver and gold from the house of the Lord and convinces Ben-hadad of Syria to attack Baasha.

Listen to what the Lord says to Asa in 2 Chronicles 16:7-9 about his actions... "Because you **RELIED** on the king of Syria and did not **RELY** on the Lord your God, the army of the king of Syria has escaped you. Were not the Ethiopians and the Libyans a huge army with many chariots and horsemen? Yet because you **RELIED** on the Lord, he gave them into your hand. For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole Earth, to give strong support to those whose hearts are fully committed to him."

We see in these two examples from the life of Asa what it looks like to fully rely upon the Lord in prayer and what it looks like to take matters in your own hands. We see the importance of praying first. When confronted with hardship, opposition and difficulty God is looking for his people to fully rely on him in prayer. Fully relying on God doesn't mean that we are totally passive or inactive. It means that we pray before we act and while we act.

Another lesson we learn from Asa is the danger of not relying on God when we are older. The first 35 years of Asa's reign are characterized by his reliance on the Lord. However, the last 6 years of his reign are characterized by self-reliance. 2 Chronicles 16:12 says, "In the 39th year of his reign Asa was diseased in his feet, and his disease became severe. Yet even in his disease he did not seek the Lord." Asa started well. For the majority of his life, he fully relied upon God but in his latter years, he took matters in his own hands. May God help us to finish well. Even in our last days, may it be said of us that we fully relied upon the Lord.

I promise you this, the devil will do all that he can to keep you from praying. He knows the power of prayer. He will offer every excuse in the book to keep us off our knees. Nothing strikes more fear in his heart than to see God's people passionately pursuing Him in prayer. Can you imagine what God would do in our families and in our church if we got serious about praying. Fully relying on God always involves prayer. May God lead each one of us to fully rely on Him in prayer.



These programs are planned and sponsored by the Seniors Ministry, but they are open to all ages.


