Glorifying God Through Restoration of Relationships

Breaking a bone is incredibly painful. The broken bone is out of place and must be put back, restored to its original location. As we look around our country today, it is easy to see that our relationships with each other are broken in many ways. When Adam and Eve sinned in the garden, not only did it alter their relationship with God, it also damaged their relationship with each other. Ever since the fall, mankind has experienced the destructive power of sin on human relationships.

The good news of the gospel is that through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, God is at work restoring our relationship with Him and each other. Jesus Christ described this restoration of relationship in Matthew 12:48-50 when he asked, "Who is my mother and who are my brothers? And stretching out his hand toward his disciples, he said, 'here are my mother and my brothers! For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother.'" Jesus is declaring to His own flesh and blood family that only through receiving Him as Lord do you begin to experience true restoration of relationship.

Think about the diversity of the twelve disciples: fisherman, tax collectors, national zealots, married men, single men, all coming together to the glory of God to form a new family. Jesus longed for His disciples to experience this restoration of relationship. In John 17, Jesus prays over and over again for His disciples to experience the oneness that exist within the Trinity. He prays in John 17:21, "that they may all be one just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me."

Jesus previews the ultimate restoration of relationship in Revelation 7:9 when, ". . . a great multitude that no one can number from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb." This is the glorious picture of humanity restored to God and one another through the blood of the Lamb. As followers of Jesus Christ, we glorify God by displaying, to a watching world, the power of the gospel bringing a true restoration of relationships.

The world is watching. The church needs to demonstrate the sacrificial love of Jesus one to another. The church has the opportunity to show the world how the gospel, not only restores our relationship with God, but also our relationship with each other.

Men's Prayer Breakfast & Bible Study

The Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study will meet again on July 18th and resume its regular twice per month schedule in August, meeting on August 1st and August 15th.

On July 18th, the study continues with Acts 25 and Paul's imprisonment in Caesarea and his appearance before the Roman governor, Porcius Festus. After being accused by the Jewish leadership in Jerusalem of *"many and serious charges,"* all of which he denied, Paul as a Roman citizen, informed the governor that he wanted to appeal his case before Caesar. To which Festus replied, *"To Caesar you have appealed, to Caesar you shall go."* (Acts 25:12)

The remainder of chapter 25 discusses Festus' introduction of Paul's case to the Judean King, Herod Agrippa II, with Paul's defense before him presented in chapter 26. It concludes with Agrippa stating, *"This man could have been set free if he had not appealed to Caesar."*

Paul's event-filled voyage to Rome will be discussed in chapter 27.

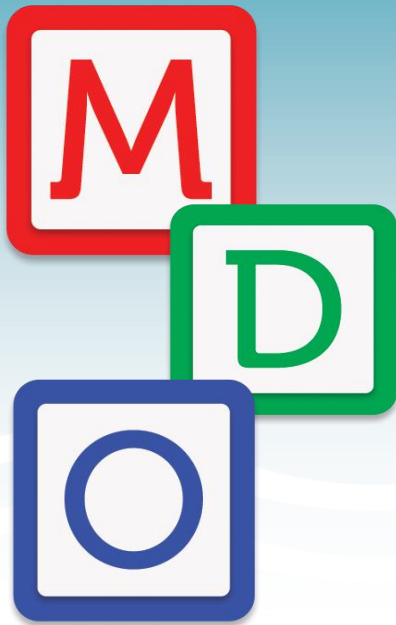

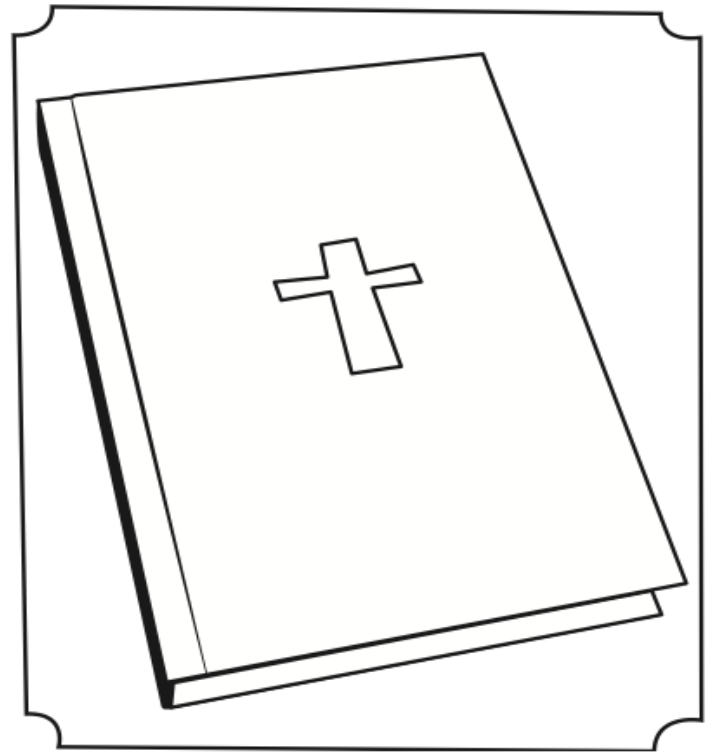

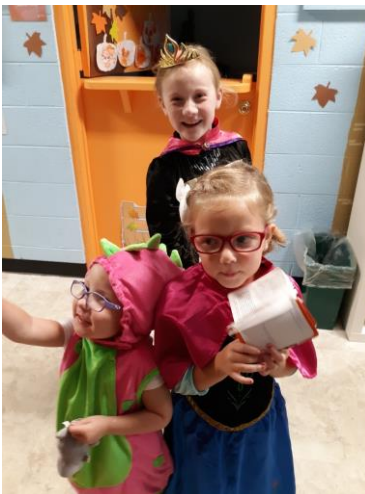
A YEAR IN SCC AWANA TO REMEMBER!!!

- The names and ages of each of the children participating from your home.
- Any food allergies we should be aware of (we will be sending snacks home that correspond to the lessons).

We are excited to get to serve you and your children even though we will not be able to meet in person.

Here's how it will work this year:

- We will pack a box 'suitcase' for each family with all the supplies you'll need for the week. The supplies for each day will be bagged separately and labelled for ease of use.
- Every evening at 6:20 we will be waiting on Zoom for you to sign in with your kids (We'll send the email invitation with the login information).
- From 6:20 to 6:30 we will be making sure everyone can see and hear each other and hopefully have time to catch up on what kids have been learning, see the creations they've made in their VBS activities that week and letting them share their 'God sightings'. So, the earlier you arrive on Zoom, the more we can hear from your kids!
- From 6:30 to 7:00 we'll have a song, then go into our lesson for the evening and end with another song.
- We will introduce and explain the craft/activity that we've included in your boxes for that day before we end each evening. Then at your discretion the kids can either work on that after we finish our lesson, or it can be saved to do the following day before our next lesson time.
- For anyone not able to join us live on any evening, we will also be simultaneously recording on Facebook Live, so that video will be available to view at a time convenient to your family. The only thing that will be missing from the Facebook video will be music. In order to avoid copyright infringement, we will not be posting the music portion on the internet.

We're looking forward to joining you on this exciting journey through Ephesians 6:10-18!
