We need righteousness to be acceptable to God. But we don't have it. What we have is sin.

So, God has what we need and don't deserve – righteousness; and we have what God hates and rejects – sin. What is God's answer to this situation?

His answer is Jesus Christ, this Son of God who died in our place and bore our condemnation. "By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he [God] condemned sin in the flesh" (Romans 8:3). Whose flesh bore the condemnation? His. Whose sins were being condemned? Ours. This is the great exchange. Here it is again in 2 Corinthians 5:21: "For our sake

For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "The just shall live by faith."






