GOD DELIGHTS IN DOING NEW THINGS!

“Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.”

Isaiah 43: 18,19

How many of us like to try new things? Or maybe a better question is, how many of us like change? There is a sense in which we are all creatures of habit. We have our patterns, our way of doing things and we are not too happy when something new comes along and changes our comfortable routines.

In March of 2020, God in His providence brought change, as He allowed a global pandemic known as Covid-19. For most of the world, things changed drastically. For almost 3 months there was a total lockdown. We became acquainted with new terms like social distancing. I remember the first time going into a store where people were literally turned away if they didn't have a mask on. This was all **new** to us.

March 15th was the first Sunday that church was canceled in the sense that we were not allowed to gather together. For the next month, I preached from my dining room table (along with the help of Jessica). We became familiar with a **new** thing called “Facebook Live.” April 12th, Easter Sunday, was the first Sunday that we worshipped from the sanctuary as the praise team led worship. I was so thankful for the praise team and our audio/visual team. Each week their faithful service allowed people at home to join us in worship. We still were not allowed to have more than 10 people gather together. That was the first time I had preached in an empty sanctuary. This was all **new** to us.

Sunday, May 31, 2020, was the first Sunday we were allowed to have worshipers in the sanctuary. Everyone was required to social distance and wear a mask but at least we were able to gather together. I can't tell you how excited I was to see some of your faces in the pews. It was very emotional for all of us. For the past year this was the **new** normal for Sunday worship.

Not long after that, Ron Raymer started teaching one of our adult Sunday School classes which also allowed those still at home to join in a conference call to listen to the class. This **new** thing was a tremendous blessing to our church family. On the first Sunday in September, we started something new called the Family Sunday School Class. This is something that we had never done before. But God used this **new** thing to be a blessing to our families.

Toward the end of September, AYM and AWANA started meeting again. In order for these ministries to meet, they had to change and adapt. They had to do **new** things in order to minister to our youth and children. But God used these **new** ways to bless our families. Our Good News Club that ministers to Woodstock Elementary had to do something **new**. Instead of going to the school and sharing God's Word, we had to meet through zoom. Ah yes, ZOOM - something **new** that most of us have become very acquainted with. But again, this turned out to be a blessing as we were able to develop meaningful relationships with the children who were joining through zoom.

Operation Christmas Child was a tremendous success even with all the challenges. We had to do OCC in a completely **new** way this past year, but God worked through it to bless children all around the world with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Our food pantry has continued to minister to needy families in our community on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each month, again in a **new** way.

After a year of leading worship, the praise team passed the baton to the choir on the first Sunday in March. As Lynn gathered the choir, they had to practice in a **new** way. But God is working through these **new**, unfamiliar ways to glorify Him and bless His people. I know I'm probably missing some of the new things that took place in the past year, but I believe you get the point. This past year has been a year of change, a year of **new** things.

And now here we are June of 2021, still changing, still adapting, still doing **new** things. This past Sunday was the first Sunday that we took the tape down and put the Bibles and hymnals back in the pews. It was the first Sunday in over a year where most of the congregation were not wearing masks. It feels like a **new** thing. We are becoming comfortable being near other people, giving them a hug, or shaking their hand.

The first Sunday in June, more **new** things will be taking place. No longer will we have the Family Sunday School Class. Instead, we will have two **new** Sunday School classes for children, a **new** middle school class, and a **new** adult Bible study along with a nursery for Sunday School and worship. I am really excited about these **new** things taking place. **This is a time of new beginnings.**

God told his people in Isaiah 43 not to dwell on the past, on the former things, that He was doing a **new** thing. God was going to save his people in a **new** way, through a **new** Deliverer. God's **new** salvation would come through the work of His Son, Jesus Christ. Jesus would be the **new** Moses who would save His people from the foreign power of sin and from the kingdom of Satan. Instead of saving them through the sacrifice of a lamb, God would save His people through the sacrifice of His Son. This was a **new** way, or as Jesus said, the **New Covenant**.

It is through faith in Jesus Christ that God does a new work in our lives. Second Corinthians 5:17 says that in Christ, we are a new creation. The old patterns, the old ways of sin are gone. God is doing a **new** work in us. He is conforming us into the image of Jesus. He is preparing us for the **new** Heaven and the **new** Earth.

Praise God for the **new** things He has done, and the **new** things He is yet to do!

Men's Breakfast & Bible Study

The Saturday Morning Men's Breakfast and Bible Study continues to meet on the first and third Saturdays of each month. This month we will meet on June 5th and June 19th to study the **Book of 1 Timothy**, the first of Paul's pastoral epistles (letters written to church leaders). As always, it will be a chapter by chapter, verse by verse, word by word, comprehensive study.

Timothy was a protégé of Paul's and the leader of the fledgling Christian Church in Ephesus. Although only a few years in existence, the church had already been influenced by Greek myths and philosophies, Jewish teachings and traditions, and false doctrines.

The study began last month with **Chapter 1** and an introduction to Paul's instructions and encouragement to Timothy to be steadfast in leading the church and to resist the various false teachers. He charged him to oppose all through love, sound doctrine and a sincere faith and gave Timothy clear instructions on how to "fight the good fight."

This month, in **Chapter 2**, Paul urged Timothy to offer prayers, intercessions and thanksgivings for all people for "God our Savior . . . desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (2:3-4). And in **Chapter 3**, he presents qualifications for church leaders. In **Chapter 4**, Paul gives Timothy guidelines on how to conduct himself, and in **Chapter 5**, he provides instructions for the church.

The Men's Breakfast and Bible Study is an outstanding opportunity for the study of God's Word, prayer, and fellowship for men of all ages; church members and non-members. Come and enjoy a good, homemade breakfast of eggs, sausage, pancakes, biscuits, grits, sausage gravy, fruit, orange juice, and coffee.

Breakfast begins at 8:00 AM and is followed at 8:30 with Bible Study and prayer. It concludes by about 9:30 AM, leaving plenty of time for Saturday morning obligations.
