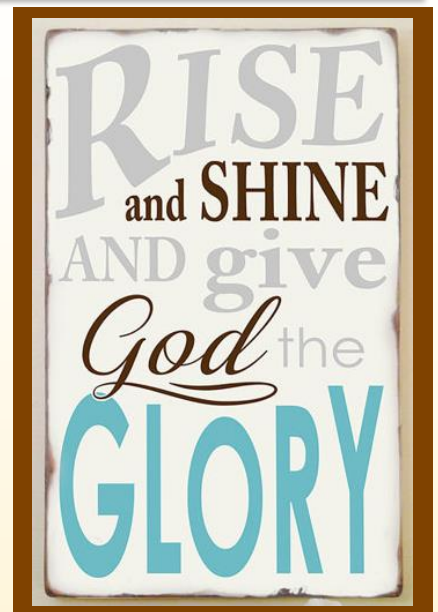

1. We are to rise and shine for our light has come! (60:1)

Rise and Shine continued...

"It is too light a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to bring back the preserved of Israel; I will make you as a light for the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth."

Jesus understood that he was the light to come, that he was the light for the nations. Jesus said in John 8:12, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life." John would say earlier of Jesus, in John 1:9, "The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world."

Jesus has come! He came as The Light! He is the one and only source of light. As the church of Jesus Christ, his light must shine through us.

2. We are to rise and shine because darkness covers the earth. (60:2)

Isaiah 60:2 says, "For behold, darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples."

Jesus said in John 3:19-20, "And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light lest his works should be exposed."

As Christians, we find ourselves living in a world of darkness. Satan, the god this world is doing all that he can to blind the minds of unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ. (2 Cor. 4:4)

The only hope for this sinful world, is for the church, for you and me, to shine brightly with the light of Jesus Christ.

3. We are to rise and shine, to attract sinners to Jesus! (60:3)

Jesus told his followers in Matthew 5:14-16, "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others so that they may see your good works and give glory to your father who is in heaven."

Isaiah gives examples of the good works that will reflect the light of Christ in Isaiah 58:7,8 when he says, "Is it not to share your bread with the hungry and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover him, and not to hide yourself from your own flesh? Then shall your light break forth like the dawn and your healing shall spring up speedily; your righteousness shall go before you; the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard." When we love one another, and care for one another's needs, we reflect the light of Jesus Christ in a dark world. This kind of loving service has a way of drawing people to Jesus.

God has strategically placed every one of us to shine, to reflect the light of Jesus Christ in our families, our jobs, our neighborhoods, and our communities. May we, each and every day, rise and shine and give God the glory!

Saturday Morning Men's Breakfast & Bible Study

The Saturday Morning Men's Breakfast and Bible Study continues to meet on the first and third Saturdays of each month. In November, we will meet on the 6th and the 20th. As always, it will be a chapter by chapter, verse by verse, word by word, comprehensive study.

During those sessions we will begin a study of **Paul's letter to Titus**. Titus, a Gentile convert, was one of Paul's disciples, a trusted coworker and the leader of the church Paul had established on Crete.



The letter, one of Paul's Pastoral Epistle, was written around 64-65 sometime after Paul's first imprisonment in Rome. In it, Paul provided the same counsel that he had given to Timothy regarding false teachers and false teachings, because those in the church on Crete were just as susceptible to them as were those in Ephesus. In fact, they were already influencing the church. Paul encouraged Titus to develop a church faithful to doctrinal purity and proper conduct.

Like with Timothy, Paul gave Titus instruction on qualifications and roles of various groups of people; elders, overseers, older and young men, older and young women, and slaves; as well as encouragement to all believers: *"For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people . . . (2:11)"*

He also wrote about the *"blessed hope"* of Christ's Second Coming and eternal life for the believer, emphasizing the *"renewal of the Holy Spirit" (3:5)* that prepares believers to be *"made heirs according to the hope of eternal life" (3:7)*.

The Men's Breakfast and Bible Study is an outstanding opportunity for the study of God's Word, prayer, and fellowship for men of all ages; church members and non-members.

The breakfast and the Bible study are open to all men, and all are invited to enjoy a good, homemade breakfast of eggs (scramble and fried), sausage, corned beef hash, pancakes, biscuits, grits, sausage gravy, fruit, orange juice, and coffee. Come and enjoy good fellowship, and the Good News found in God's Word.

Breakfast begins at 8:00 AM and is followed at 8:30 with Bible Study and prayer. It concludes by about 9:30 AM, leaving plenty of time for Saturday morning obligations.

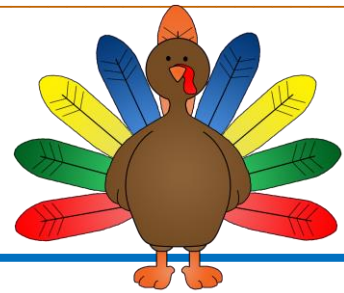

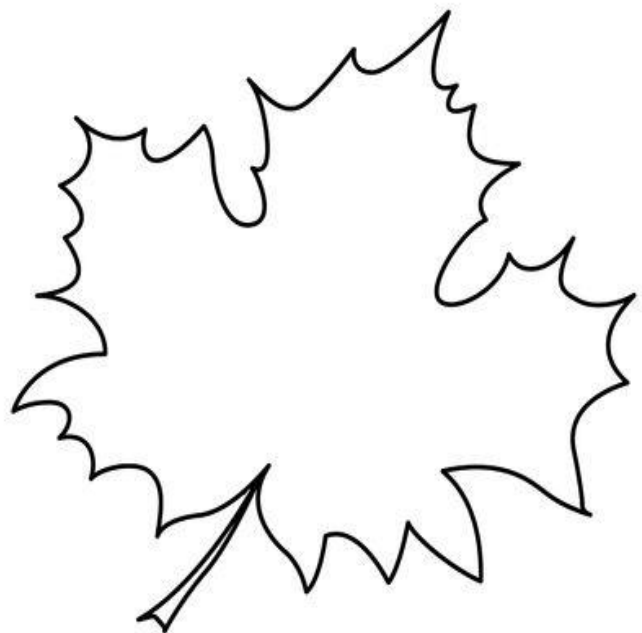

Operation Christmas Child Corner

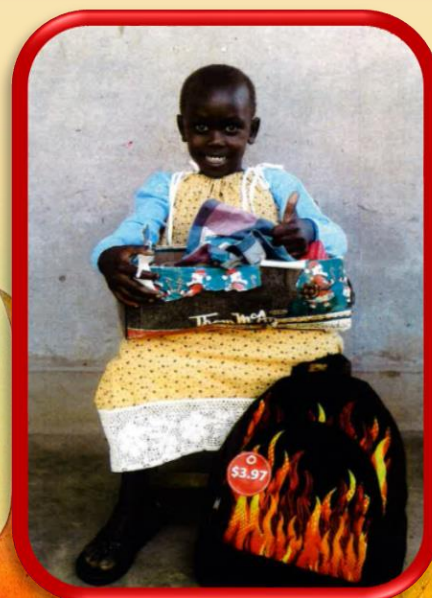

The Issue: Pushing Your Limits

Far too often we try to push the limits of what we know when we should not do. We often live trying to see how much we can “get away with” without actually crossing the line and sinning. Should we really be flirting with sin and trying to get as close to the edge as possible, or should we have a different focus?

Let's look at what the Bible has to say about the focus we should have:

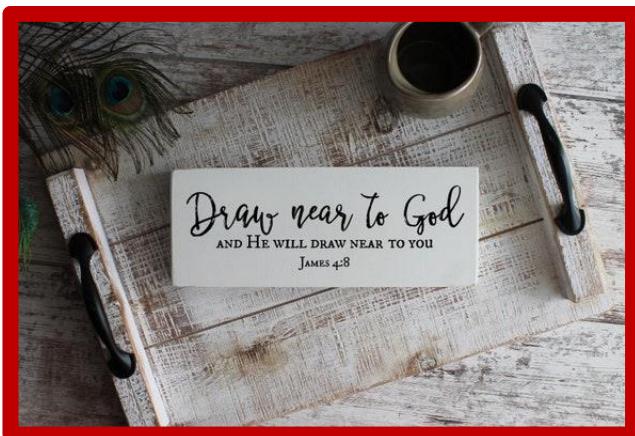


- *I Chronicles 28: 9 - **God knows our heart. He wants us to see Him.**
- *Psalm 27: 4 – **Our sole focus should be to grow closer to God.**
- *Psalm 139: 23, 24 – **We should ask God to direct us in His ways.**
- *Proverbs 16: 2 – **Beyond just our actions, God looks at our motives.**
- *II Timothy 2: 22 – **Flee the dangers of sin and pursue godliness.**

According to Scripture, what should I do?

Scripture gives overwhelming support that our focus should not be on pushing the limits, but rather on being committed to doing all things in a way that clearly glorifies God and draws us closer to Him in obedience. Some good questions we must ask ourselves are:

- *How well are my actions **pleasing** God? (I Corinthians 10:31)
- *How well are my actions **drawing** me **closer** to God? (James 4:8)



God is not pleased when our desire is to push to the edge of what we think is “okay” (He does not want us going in the direction that leads us away from Him)! However, God is pleased when we make decisions that draw us closer to Him in obedience. Let us apply these principles to every aspect of our lives, so that in all we do, we will continually be pursuing Him and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33; I Timothy 6:11).
