From The Pastor's Desk:

HOW TO DEAL WITH MY SIN? PSALM 25

As human beings, there are some things we all have in common. We were all created beings. Every man and woman have been created in the image of God. Another thing we share is the need for food and drink in order to survive. God designed us in such a way that we must eat and drink in order to live. Another area of commonality is sin. Every human bean is a sinner. We all inherited from Adam and Eve a sinful nature. We have sinned in the past, we will sin today, and we will sin tomorrow. Sin is a major issue in our lives. The question is, what are we to do with our sin? In Psalm 25, David addresses the sin in his life. We can learn from David. We can learn how to deal with our sin.

*David focused on the magnitude of God's mercy. "Remember your mercy, O Lord, and your steadfast love, for they have been from of old. Remember not the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to your steadfast love remember me, for the sake of your goodness, O Lord!" Psalm 25:6-7

Yes, David saw his sin, but his focus was on the mercy of God. When we sin, it is so easy to fix our eyes on how we have messed up. This plays right into the devil's hand. He would love nothing more than to keep you focused on your sin. We need to learn from David to focus on the tender mercy of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. No matter how bad we've messed up, the grace and mercy of Jesus is infinitely greater.

***David confessed his sin.** "For your name's sake, O Lord, pardon my guilt, for it is great. Consider my affliction and my trouble, and forgive all my sins." Psalm 25:11,18

David didn't try to excuse his sin. He didn't try to give God all the reasons for why he sinned. No, David confessed his sin. David didn't try to minimize his sin. He didn't try to convince God that his sin was not that big of a deal. No, David confessed that his sin was great. David didn't try to ignore his sin. He didn't try to play games with God about his sin. No, David confessed his sin and came clean with God. I John 1:9 says, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Don't try to excuse, minimize or ignore your sin... come clean with God, confess your sin and you will be forgiven.

*David turned from his sin and walked in obedience to God. "Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I will wait all the day long." Psalm 25:4-5

It was David's desire for God to lead him in his truth, to teach him the paths to walk in, to make him know the ways of obedience. David earnestly longed for God to guide his steps in the path of righteousness. For the Christian, repentance involves not just turning away from sin but also turning to Jesus and following him in obedience. It involves a daily dying to self/sin, dying to the old way of life and walking in loving obedience to God's Word.

David was a sinner just like you and me. We can learn from David. We can learn how to deal with our sin. We can learn how to preach God's mercy to our sinful hearts. We can learn how to confess our sins and come clean with God. We can learn how to turn from sin and follow Jesus every day.


Just for Ambassador Youth Ministry

Authentic Community

Being a part of a community is more than being surrounded by people or having a position on a team or group. Many people are part of several groups but are still lonely. This happens because the depth of their community is shallow; it lacks authenticity and purpose. Often these shallow groups are filled with people who refuse to open up or pretend to be someone they're not (they wear masks).

The thing is, to follow Christ, to join his mission of making disciples and reaching the lost and the least of this world, we need some serious help. We need a ton of abilities, gifts, talents, resources, and wisdom. Thankfully, God already knew that. He set up the church to be a community where Christfollowers could get together, worship him, and do great things. The people who make up Christ's Church should help each other out, rely on each other, and reach the corners of the world with the story of Jesus. Unfortunately, many of us have downgraded church to just the place we go on Sundays.

Take some time to evaluate your own community. Think of five to ten friends (maybe the ones in your small group or youth group) and write their names in the circles below according to the depth of your relationship.



1. FACE: You recognize them, but you don't really know them.

2. FACTS: Now you know their name, a little bit about them, where they live, what they like, what their family is like.

3. FEELINGS: Your relationship starts to go a little deeper – you learn about their opinions, how they feel about certain subjects, events, and a little bit of their story.

4. FEARS: Once you get to an authentic level of friendship, people begin to share their deepest concerns, their fears, and their anxieties. They start taking off the mask so you can see the real person beneath.

5. FAITH: This is the deepest level of friendship. You know about their walk with God; their temptations; their weaknesses; and their spiritual gifts, goals, and passions.

Hebrews 10:24-25 says, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." How does this verse relate to "authentic community?"



Saturday Morning Men's Breakfast & Bible Study October 1 & 15, 2022 The Book of 1 Samuel

The Saturday Morning Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study will meet in October on the 1st and the 15th and will begin the study on the Book of 1 Samuel. As usual, the study will feature a chapter by chapter, verse by verse, word by word, comprehensive Bible study.

Throughout the **Book of Judges**, the study centered on the fact that, **"In those days there was no king in Israel and everyone did what was right in their own eyes."**

This month we will begin a study on the establishment of Israel's Kingdom. The Book of Samuel documents the history of Israel as it moves from being individual tribes under the rule of judges to a unified nation under kings. The study will begin with an introduction on Samuel's miraculous birth, his mother's dedication of him to the LORD and his life as a Nazirite. It proceeds through God's selection of a king despite the prophet's insistence that Israel already had a king; God Almighty. It records the rise and fall of Saul and the rise of David. The study will be divided into two sections: the life of Samuel (chapters 1-12) and the life of Saul (chapters 13-31).



Belong Women's Ministry Fall Bible Study Update

Session One Summary: Extraordinary Mercy

God created and delights in every day AND he created and delights in us, too! His love for us is so great that he sacrificed his only Son to bring us closer to himself. This is particularly extraordinary because every ordinary day, we do, say, or think something that should separate us from God. Our sin is so real and constant. No amount of good behavior could make up for it. YET, God saw our sin and inability to redeem ourselves. Romans 5:8 tells us, "But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." This is truly EXTRAORDINARY! God loves us – ordinary people living ordinary lives – so much that he gave up the life of his precious Son, shouldering the punishment our sin earned us. Our debt was paid. The insurmountable barrier that our sin created between God and us was demolished. What does this mean for us? Our ordinary life, ordinary moments, tasks, routines, and schedules are now infused with the magnificence of God's grace. The now, the present of your life is extraordinary, not because of what we do, but because of what God has done for us. So, we can delight in this regular day. Psalm 118:24 says, "This is the day



that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." Today is God-made. You never know what part of his story our extraordinary God is writing through your ordinary moments.

Session Two Summary: Extraordinary Restoration

Most of us like surprises – especially good ones. None of us likes to get bad news. When we suffer, it is a natural reaction to question God. Job (and his wife) were very familiar with suffering. The manner in which Job lost everything is tragic. Job's wife seems to reach her breaking point when Job was struck with boils. She tells Job to "curse God and die."

Job and his friends argue about the reasons for the suffering and cannot find the answer to the question, "Why?" When we suffer, we may find ourselves asking why. But our real question is more personal than that. Our real question is this: "Can I trust you, God? Can I trust you even when I don't understand you?" How does Scripture answer this question? Romans 8:28 says, "And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose." We may never understand why. But even when we don't understand our Lord, we can trust him. His love for us is unconditional and his commitment to do the very best things for us knows no limits. In everything, he is at work for our good.


