There were a number of obstacles hindering the church in Rome from coming together. One such hurdle was their different upbringings. The church in Rome was populated with both Jew and Gentile. The Jews of course, were brought up with their traditions and regulations based on the Old Testament Scripture. The Gentiles on the other hand, being mostly pagan, had no context for Jewish holy days, rituals, or dietary restrictions. You can imagine how these incredibly diverse groups would have a difficult time in accepting one another.

Our year verse for 2024, Romans 15:7, summarizes Paul's teaching on unity that began all the way back in chapter 14. In Romans 14:1 Paul says, "As for the one who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not to quarrel over opinions." For nearly 2 chapters, Paul has been making a case for, and encouraging the Roman believers to develop a culture of accepting one another. Why does Paul spend so much time addressing this issue? There are a number of reasons, but one is the reality that achieving this harmony will not be easy peezy. Paul knows that in order for the church at Rome to truly welcome one another it will require the power of the Holy Spirit.

So, when Paul calls us to welcome one another in Romans 15:7, what does he mean by that, and what does that look like? The meaning of the word **welcome** in the original is to grant access into one's heart; to receive into one's home with kindness; to take as one's companion; to take hold of and bring face-to-face; to draw other people into your inner circle of relationships. Welcoming one another is much more than putting on a smiling face. Welcoming one another means to embrace one another in spite of our different upbringings, personalities and preferences. This is Paul's message not only to the Christian church in Rome but to Suburban Christian church in Virginia Beach.

My prayer for our Suburban family in 2024 is that God will open our hearts to truly welcome one another. Think about how Jesus Christ has opened his heart, his home, and welcomed each and every one of us. With all of our sin and baggage Jesus opened his arms and fully embraced us. As Christ has welcomed us, we also are to welcome one another. Paul says that when believers open their hearts to one another, it brings glory to God. One of the greatest ways that Suburban can display the glory of God in 2024 is through pursuing the warm embrace of family...God's family!

Now may the God of endurance and encouragement grant us to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, that together we may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen (Romans 15:5,6)



Pass the Salt

"You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored: It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet. You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." Matthew 5:13-16

"Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving. At the same time, pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the word, to declare the mystery of Christ, on account of which I am in prison – that I may make it clear, which is how I ought to speak. Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time. Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person." Colossians 4:2-6

In Matthew 5:13-16 and Colossians 4:2-6, we read that Christians are like salt. But what does that mean? What does salt do in practical terms? And how does this apply to our everyday lives?

First, salt adds flavor. As Christians, we can add flavor to the lives of the people around us by sharing the love of Jesus. When we add salt to other people's lives, they get a taste of what Jesus is like (Psalm 34:8).

Second, salt makes you thirsty, letting your body know you need water. And like salt, Christians can help people around us become aware of their need for Jesus. When people see what knowing Jesus truly means to us and hear about what He's done for us, they might become interested in knowing more about Him for themselves (John 7:37).

Third, in the days before modern medicine, salt was often used to disinfect a wound. In a similar way, Christians have the good news of Jesus. He has provided the antidote for sin and all the brokenness it causes through dying on the cross and rising form the grave for us. Because we know Jesus, we get to look forward to the day He will return and fully restore His creation, and in the meantime, we get to see glimpses of His healing in our own lives – whether it be physically, spiritually, emotionally, or relationally. Sharing the story of Jesus in a loving way reminds us of the healing work Jesus has done in us and introduces others to the healing He can do in their lives.

So today, let us consider how we might share the salt of God's healing love with our community, and let us rest in that same salty story where we found – and continue to find – our healing.


Questions:
