OUR AMERICAN CULTURE HAS MARGINALIZED THE CHURCH

I remember growing up as a child in the 70's playing community sports – baseball, football, and basketball. Games and practices were scheduled throughout the week, but never on Sunday (not even on Wednesday). Sunday was off- limits for rec-league sports. Sunday was seen as the day people went to church. Today, however, Sunday is just another day, and games are scheduled from sun-up to sun-down. This minimizing of the church has taken a toll on many "churchgoing" families, so that if there is a scheduling conflict on Sunday, sports/activities come first, and church is easily moved to the back of the line.

However, at Suburban in 2025, we are going to focus our attention on the church – "our church," and our year verse will help us do that. Our 2025-year verse emphasizes the significance of the church with a striking 3-fold description of the church. The church alone is God's family. The church alone is where God resides. And the church alone is where God's truth is found.

1.THE CHURCH IS THE HOUSEHOLD OF GOD (I Timothy 3:15)

The church is the family of God. As members of Suburban Christian Church, we are God's family. We became God's family by repenting of our sin and believing on Jesus to be our Savior. Entrance into God's family comes only through believing on Jesus . . . and each member must personally embrace Christ.

Does God have a plan to care for His family the church? You bet He does! Just as God planned for the care of earthly families by providing a father and a mother, God also designed the roles of pastors and deacons to care for his spiritual family, the church. This coming year, we will with God's help, develop a plan and timeline to transition to pastors and deacons to better care for God's family. Pray, pray, pray for God to go before us. Pray for God's wisdom each step of the way.

2.THE CHURCH IS THE PLACE WHERE GOD DWELLS (I Timothy 3:15)

We are the church, the people of the living God. The New Testament teaches us that God no longer resides in a tabernacle, or temple, or a special city. Now the living God dwells within his people the church. Second Corinthians 6:16 says, "For we are the sanctuary of the living God." Ephesians 2:22 says, "You are being built together for God's dwelling in the Spirit."

The people of Suburban Christian Church are the place where God lives and dwells and makes his presence known. In 2025, let's remember this precious truth every time we gather in worship to hear his Word. The living God joyfully makes his home with us! No other organization, activity, or society – only the church, his family, can say, "God lives with us!"

3. THE CHURCH IS A PILLAR AND BUTTRESS OF THE TRUTH (I TIMOTHY 3:15)

The people in Ephesus would have understood Paul's architectural imagery. The temple of Diana was one of the 7 wonders of the world. It had a massive shining marble roof held high with 127 strong columns all around it, each measuring 60 feet high.

The church is called like a pillar to hold high the truth of the Gospel of Christ. We have the privilege of putting Jesus Christ on display so others will see and believe in Christ. The church as a buttress or foundation of the church is responsible for protecting, defending and holding fast to God's truth revealed in Christ. What an incredible blessing to be entrusted with the care and proclamation of **THE TRUTH!**

In conclusion . . .

There is nothing like the church in this world. In all of history, there is nothing more significant than Christ's Church.

- The church has been founded by Christ (Matthew 16:18,19)
- To create the church, Christ had to die (Ephesians 5:25)
- Christ identifies intimately with the church (Acts 9:4,5)
- Christ describes the church as his own body and bride (Ephesians 5 29,30)
- The church alone shines forth making visible the goodness of Christ (Matthew 5:14-16)

In God's estimation, the church is his highest priority. In God's eyes, the church is always under his watchful care. In God's wisdom, the church is his plan for accomplishing his purposes in the world. Pray for us this year as we focus on developing and implementing God's plan for **HIS CHURCH** – for His glory and our good.

A Body of Praise - How should we worship?

On Sunday mornings when we come to worship, we bring bodies with particularities, limitations, and five senses that ought to be engaged. We were each uniquely created by God, specifically for worship of the Creator. Our bodies are both recipients and instruments of God's love for us. When you come to worship have you ever wondered how to use



your body? Do you simply sit and listen? Do you stand and sing, only moving your mouth to issue praise to the Lord? Do you bow your head in prayer and perhaps fold your hands? These are all very typical postures our bodies assume during worship.

Corporate worship, the coming together of many believers, is a regular Sunday morning event for us. We pray, sing and listen to God's word, all the while using our bodies to intake information and process it, and then what? Have you ever felt the urge to do something else? Have you fought the temptation to tap your toes to a song that catches your interest? How about clapping along to a song? Surely that is something you've been motivated to do on occasion. How about a visit to the altar? How do you respond to those urges?

Begin with the heart - The heart of worship isn't attitudinal or merely spiritual. The heart drives our worship because it is where we intake God's word and process our response to it. The heart of worship includes the posture of our bodies. Our bodies usher us into and facilitate worship, both individually and congregationally. Therefore, it is important that when we engage in corporate worship, we should never settle for just going through the motions.

Respond with the body – during worship, that UIP (unidentified inner prompting) is likely coming from God Himself. If you have aligned your heart with God's during worship, you may feel God's prompting to do more than receive. He wants you to *express* your worship. But you say: "God knows my heart; I don't have to raise my hands or kneel for God to receive my worship". And you are absolutely right. But if you have received an inner prompting, God wants more, He wants your FULL response, not one held back by concern of what others might think. If that UIP says clap, then clap! If it says kneel, then drop to your knees! If it says raise your hands, then raise them high for the Lord!

Corporate worship isn't an organized weekly gathering, like a concert or a sporting event. It is a carefully planned experience to invite God's Holy Spirit to harmonize our individual worship into a powerful corporate offering of praise to our Creator. By limiting our response, we withhold some of that adoration, not fully giving the glory our God is due.

So as we enter a new year, worshipping together at Suburban, consider your response to those inner promptings. Leave your inhibitions at the door and enter wholly into worship of the One who deserves it all!



Ambassador Youth Ministry - Ten Questions for a New Year by Don Whitney



Even those most faithful to God occasionally need to pause and think about the direction of their lives. It's so easy to bump along from one busy week to another without ever stopping to ponder where we're going and where we should be going.

Once, when the people of God had become careless in their relationship with him, the Lord rebuked them through the prophet Haggai: "Consider your ways!" (Haggai 1:5). He urged them to reflect on some of the things happening to them, and to evaluate their slipshod spirituality in light of what God had told them.

The beginning of a new year is an ideal time to stop, look up, and get our bearings. A great time for us to "Consider our ways." To that end, here are some questions to ask prayerfully in the presence of God.

1. What's one thing you can do this year to increase your enjoyment of God? Our enjoyment of God comes primarily through the means of grace he has given us. He has promised to bless us most directly and consistently through means such as his word, prayer, and the church. One specific suggestion I'd offer would be to include some *meditation* on Scripture along with your daily reading. It's better to read less - if necessary - and yet as the result of meditation remember *something*, than to read more and remember *nothing*.

2. What's an impossible prayer you can pray? There are more than a dozen "but God" statements in Scripture, such as in Romans 5:8, which reads, "but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Situations that were humanly impossible were transformed by "but God" (Ephesians 2:1-7). What's a "but God" prayer you can pray for the coming year?

3. What's the most important thing you could do to improve your family life? If your family doesn't practice family worship, beginning there is the single best recommendation I could make. Just ten minutes a day, simply reading the Bible, praying, and singing together – an event that requires no preparation – is all it takes. My little book titled *Family Worship* can tell you more.

4. In which spiritual discipline do you most want to make progress this year? Would it be a *personal* spiritual discipline (that is, one you practice alone), or an *interpersonal* spiritual discipline (one you practice with other believers)? Once you decide, determine the next step to take and when you will take it.

5. What's the single biggest time-waster in your life, and how can you redeem the time? Social media? TV? Video games? Sports? Hobbies? It's easy for any of these (or something else) to take too much of our hearts and time. Is repentance required? Trying to stop, by itself, is probably not the answer. Actively replacing it with something better helps us in "making the best use of the time, because the days are evil" (Ephesians 5:16).

6. What's the most helpful new way you could strengthen your church? While we often stress the fact that individual believers are the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 6:15), the New Testament actually says seven times to one that the *church* is the body of Christ (Ephesians 5:23). We mustn't let our frequent emphasis on our personal relationship with Christ minimize the importance of our service to Jesus through his body. How can your church be stronger this year because of you? Serving? Giving? Praying?

7. For whose salvation will you pray most fervently this year? Praying frequently and fervently for someone's salvation makes us more sensitive to opportunities to share the gospel with him or her. Will you commit to praying for at least one person's salvation every day this new year?

8. What's the most important way, by God's grace, you will try to make this year different from last? Obviously, God's sovereignty rules over all things, and there is nothing we can do about much that he brings into our lives. On the other hand, under his sovereignty he gives us a measure of responsibility over many areas of life. In which of these would you most like to see a change from last year? You may find that your answer to this question is found in one of your answers above. To which of them do you sense the Holy Spirit calling your attention most urgently?

9. What one thing could you do to improve your prayer life this year? For many, it might be as simple as designating a time exclusively for prayer instead of praying only "on the go" types of prayers. For others, it might be learning the simple, biblical practice of praying the Bible.

10. What single thing can you plan to do this year that will matter most in ten years? In eternity? Short-term deadlines tend to dominate our attention. Busyness and fatigue often limit our vision to just getting through today. But don't let the tyranny of the urgent distract you from something you're neglecting that would have enormous long-term impact on your soul, your family, or your church.

Consider Your New Year

The value of many of these questions is not in their profundity, but in the simple fact that they bring an issue or commitment into focus. For example, just by making a goal to encourage one person in particular this year is more likely to help you remember to encourage that person than if you hadn't set that goal.

If you've found these questions helpful, you might want to put them someplace – on your phone, computer, calendar, or wherever you put reminders – where you can review them frequently.

I hope this article will help you to "consider your ways," to make plans and goals, and to live this new year with biblical diligence, remembering the principle that "the plans of the diligent lead surely to abundance" (Proverbs 21:5). But in all things, let's also remember our dependence on our King, who said, "Apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5).


