## From the Pastor's Desk:

#### "If Jesus Triumphed Over Sin and Death, Why Does Our World Still Contain So Much Evil and Suffering"

Written by Randy Alcorn (Founder and director of Eternal Perspective Ministries)

C. S. Lewis articulated the erroneous conclusion many people come to: "If God were good, He would wish to make His creatures perfectly happy, and if God were almighty He would be able to do what He wished. But the creatures are not happy. Therefore, God lacks either goodness, or power, or both."

Put another way, if Jesus triumphed over sin and death, why does our world still contain so much evil and suffering? Why are we still sinners, why do many of us get sick, why are some of the godliest people in the world poor, and why do all of us die? If God is happy and wants us to be happy, why doesn't He bring us complete happiness now?

There are varying responses to these excellent questions, and the good ones all require trust that a good, loving, holy, and just God knows what He's doing. By delaying His final judgment on evil and waiting longer to wipe away all tears from His children's eyes, He's giving more people a chance to repent and trust Christ (see <u>2 Peter 3:9</u>).

Meanwhile, God is giving His children more opportunities to grow in faith (see <u>1 Peter 1:6</u>), He's developing our character through trials (see <u>Job 23:10</u>; <u>Isaiah 48:10</u>), He's increasing our perseverance and hope (see <u>Romans 5:4</u>), and He's bringing more ultimate good to us and glory to Himself (see <u>Romans 8:28-29</u>).

God has redeemed us "so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus" (Ephesians 2:7). Throughout eternity, God will unfold more and more of His grace and kindness. As wonderful as Eden was, without sin and suffering, would Adam and Eve have reason to praise God for His grace? No. Certainly they could see God's goodness, but grace is unmerited favor to those who deserve Hell. Therefore, they had less reason to praise Him than we do.

Experiencing God's grace now will pay off in eternity, too. We may want to skip this growth process and be ushered directly into eternal happiness, but that wouldn't accomplish God's highest purpose. He plans to remake Earth into an eternal world where righteousness reigns because He has marvelously overcome evil, starting in the hearts of His beloved children.

Corrie ten Boom, who survived a Nazi death camp, said, "Every experience God gives us . . . is the perfect preparation for a future only He can see."

Charles Spurgeon said, "In heaven we shall see that we had not one trial too many." Reveling in God's sovereign grace, Spurgeon exclaimed, "Cheer up, Christian! Things are not left to chance—no blind fate rules the world! God has purposes and those purposes are fulfilled; God has plans and those plans are wise, and never can be dislocated!"

We can be confident that one day, happiness, not sorrow, will have the last word—and it will have the last word forever.



# AMBASSADOR YOUTH MINISTRY Check Engine Light

**Background Story:** The book of Ephesians was written as a letter from the Apostle Paul to the church of Ephesus.

#### Read Ephesians 4:17-24

So I tell you this, and insist on it in the Lord, that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their thinking. <sup>18</sup> They are darkened in their understanding and separated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them due to the hardening of their hearts. <sup>19</sup> Having lost all sensitivity, they have given themselves over to sensuality so as to indulge in every kind of impurity, and they are full of greed. <sup>20</sup> That, however, is not the way of life you learned <sup>21</sup> when you



heard about Christ and were taught in him in accordance with the truth that is in Jesus. <sup>22</sup> You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; <sup>23</sup> to be made new in the attitude of your minds; <sup>24</sup> and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.

## Big Idea: I must learn to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit.

For all you drivers out there, you learn pretty quickly to pay attention to those little lights on the dashboard. You're driving down the road listening to music and all of a sudden, the check engine light comes on alerting you to a problem happening in the car's engine. You might be able to keep driving the car for a little while; but that light has come on for a reason and ignoring it could seriously hurt your car.

As Christians, we get up every morning, put on our shoes, and walk out the door starting a new day. Out there waiting for us are temptations that are contrary to God's plan. The purity and holiness of God is in direct contrast to the way the world lives. In the passage above, we read that the world lives in ignorance, "due to the hardening of their hearts" and has "lost all sensitivity." So how do we live everyday in this world without becoming insensitive to God's leading?

The Holy Spirit lives inside the believer and is the check engine light inside our heart alerting us to avoid temptation. As you are walking through your normal day and temptation comes, the Holy Spirit will often alert and nudge you that this is not the right choice or path. As we pay attention to these alerts in our heart, we become more sensitive and attentive. As we ignore the Holy Spirit's alert, we become hardened and insensitive to His leading. Just like a car, ignoring those alerts will end up destroying your future.

Galatians 5:25 says, "If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit." To follow Christ, we must learn over time to keep "in step with the Spirit." As we follow the Holy Spirit's leading, the blessings and peace of God follow us. Today, pray asking God to help you be more sensitive to the leading of the Holy Spirit. If you've messed up and taken a wrong path, come to Him in repentance. Never keep on driving with that light blinking! Devotions4teens.com

#### Saturday Morning Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study

The Saturday Morning Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study will meet in March on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and the 16<sup>th</sup> and will continue with the study in the Book of 2 Samuel chapter 4 concerning the fall of Kings Saul's kingdom and the rise of David's.

Saul's son and successor, Ish-bosheth was weak and served only two years before he was assassinated (murdered) by two members of his own army who sought favor with David, the obvious successor to Saul's throne. (Ish-bosheth's son Mephibosheth, who was only five years old and cripples in his feet was not capable of succeeding his father). Their plan backfired when David, who always honored Saul as "the LORD'S anointed," avenged Saul's death by having them killed by being hanged at Hebron.

In chapter 5, the northern tribes of Israel joined with David, 30 years old at the time, who had reigned over Judah for seven years and now reigned over the united Judah and Israel for another thirty-three years. ("The elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron . . . and anointed David king over Israel" **2 Samuel 3**). After David and his men fought and defeated the Jebusites, he established his headquarters in a well-defended place on Mr. Zion called Jebus, which became Jerusalem; "the city of David." "And David took more concubines and wives from Jerusalem . . . and more sons and daughters were born (to him)."

The Chapter notes how, despite his human weaknesses, David inquired of and followed God's directions. Facing war with the Philistines in the Valley of Rephaim, northeast of Jerusalem, he asked God if he should do battle with them, and God gave him permission and advice. "And David did as the LORD commanded him, and he struck down the Philistines from Geba and Gezer (about 20 miles).

The Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study is an outstanding opportunity for the study of God's Word, prayer, and fellowship for men of all ages; church members and non-members. Come and enjoy good fellowship, and the Good News found in God's Word.



God is the one who gives children; they belong to Him. (Psalm 127:3) A dedication does not bring about the salvation of the child. It is not baptism. Instead, it is a set of solemn promises by the parents in the presence of the church, and an expression of faith and hope in God's future grace.

God calls every parent to the task of training up children. (Proverbs 22:6; Ephesians 6:4) Parents make a commitment to help their children live lives of personal obedience. 




## Good News Club Update

Suburban has sponsored Good News Club in Woodstock Elementary since 2019, but this may be the best year yet! Our typical Club, with around 40 first through fifth graders, weaves songs, games, Bible lessons, memory verses and lots of noise and movement. Of course, the goal is to present the Gospel of Christ to the students with an emphasis on Christ as the Son of God and only path to a relationship with God.

For the last several weeks, the emphasis of the lessons has "Jesus: God of Power and Glory." We have looked at Jesus as a powerful teacher and miracle worker. We've emphasized that God's Word is perfect and the best way to get to know God. Our lessons have covered the miracles of Jesus calming the storm, walking on water, feeding over 5,000 with just a few loaves and fishes. The latest lesson looked at Jesus healing the ten lepers (Luke 17:11-19).

How would you explain to kids who may have never heard of what leprosy is and how it would impact your life? Well, if you are Jan Grills, you would talk about how you would be excluded from society, your family and friends. (Have you ever been the last person picked for a team – or not picked at all?) And how does one explain what leprosy is like? One way is to take a marker and make "leprosy sores" on both arms – explaining that there was no cure and the sores continued to spread all over your body. Now that got everyone's attention!

What a privilege it is to teach God's timeless lessons and display His love to these students. We so appreciate






