From the Pastors Desk: “Repentance Prepares for Revival” Psalm 85:6

Genuine confession and repentance of sin are essential ingredients for revival. It is through hearing God's Word, that the Holy Spirit convicts us of sin, leading to true repentance. The church in Ephesus was in need of revival. Their love for Jesus had grown cold. They were no longer captured by the beauty and glory of Jesus Christ. The joy of the Lord was no longer their strength. Jesus Christ, through the apostle John, exposes their sin and calls the church to repentance, “But I have this against you, that you have abandoned the love you had at first. Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent, and do the work's you did at first” (Revelation 2:4,5). The greatest commandment is to love the Lord our God with our whole being (Matthew 22:36-38). Ceasing to love God with all our heart is a serious spiritual matter, that requires soul-searching repentance. Hopefully the church at Ephesus, heard the Word of Jesus, experienced conviction of sin by the Holy Spirit, leading to repentance.

Another example of God's people hearing the Word, repenting of sin, and experiencing revival is found in Nehemiah. As the Israelites continue to return home from Babylonian exile, they were in need of revival. Nehemiah beautifully captures how through the Word, God graciously convicts his people of their sin leading them to repentance and joy: “They read from the book, from the law of God, clearly, and they gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading... And the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, this day is holy to the Lord your God; do not mourn or weep. For all the people wept as they heard the words of the law” (Nehemiah 8:8,9). A discouraged and disobedient people were brought to joyful repentance as the Spirit of God spoke to the people of God through his Word.

God desires to send revival to his church. He desires to send revival to you and me. So, how can we prepare ourselves for revival? One simple way that each of us can get ready for revival is by daily hearing God speak to us through his Word. It is through the Word that the Spirit exposes our sin, convicts of sin, and grants repentance of sin. Repentance will prepare us for revival!

Saturday Morning Men's Breakfast & Bible Study

The Saturday Morning Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study will meet in February on the 5th and the 19th and will continue with the study on the **Book of Judges** that was begun last month. As usual, the study will feature a chapter by chapter, verse by verse, word by word, comprehensive Bible study.

The study began on January 8th with introductions to the function of the mid-14th – mid-13th century BC Hebrew Judges (to judge, to govern, to be a law giver) and to the compilation of the book itself (involving 12 leaders provided and used by God between Joshua [c.1375] and Samuel [c.1051], with some serving simultaneously at different locations). The recorded events probably did not occur chronologically. The Book of Judges was authored by various unknown writers (some sources attribute the book to Samuel).

The study follows the downward spiral of Israel's national and spiritual life into cycles of chaos and rebellion and punishment and repentance and deliverance; and the restoration of mercy, grace, and forgiveness of God. Its purpose was to demonstrate that God keeps His word: He will not overlook sin, it will be punished, but He will always forgive those who repent and seek His forgiveness.



On January 22nd, and in Chapter 1, the narrative explained that after the death of Joshua, who had succeeded Moses as the Israelite's leader and led the Twelve Tribes' conquest of Canaan, the Israelites found themselves leaderless and inquired of the LORD, *"Who shall go up first for us against the Canaanites, to fight against them?"* (1:1)

God provided the answer and the leadership. The chapter described the Israelites' occupation of Canaan and their continued failures to follow His direction to drive the inhabitants out of their lands. And it listed the consequences of their disobedience.

In Chapter 2, God reminded them that He had rescued them from their Egyptian captivity. He also reminded them of the conditions of their covenant obligations. *"But,"* He declared to them, *"you have not obeyed my voice."* (2:2) And the Book's cycle of disobedience, punishment, repentance, and deliverance began.

In Chapter 3, God's promised that He would raise up judges *"who (would save) them out of the hands of those who plundered them"* (2:16) was fulfilled with the raising up of the first judge, Othniel, by whose actions *"the land had rest forty years,"* (3:11) He was followed by Ehud because *"the people of Israel again did what was evil in the eyes of the LORD"* (3:7). The narratives of their service will be fully discussed.

The Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study is an outstanding opportunity for the study of God's Word, prayer, and fellowship for men of all ages; church members and non-members. The homemade breakfast consists of eggs (scramble and fried), sausage, corned beef hash, pancakes, waffles, biscuits, grits, sausage gravy, fruit, orange juice, and coffee. Come and enjoy good fellowship, and the Good News found in God's Word. It all begins at 8:00 AM and concludes around 9:30, or so.



Right now, the American Red Cross is facing a national blood crisis – our worst blood shortage in over a decade, posing a concerning risk to patient care. Operation Christmas Child Corner



THREE THINGS TRUE LOVE IS

We live in a world that gives us all kinds of messages about what true love is. The TV shows, movies, and books we read all portray love in so many different ways. Sometimes with all the different portrayals of love, it's hard to really determine what true love is. So, to help clear it up, we're going to talk about three things true love is.

1. **True love looks out for the best interests of the other person** – This means thinking about what is best for the other person. Many times, dating relationships are centered around selfish motives. For example, someone might date the starting quarterback in high school because it helps their popularity, or it makes them look good. This isn't true love because true love looks out for what is best for the other person. True love puts its own best interests on the back shelf and is looking out for the needs and interests of the other person.

"Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others." – 1 Cor. 13:4

2. **True love is based on friendship NOT the physical** – a relationship based on the physical stuff won't last. Any relationship should focus on getting to know the other person long before the physical comes into play. That's why God asks us to wait to have sex before marriage. It's one of the best ways to make sure your relationship will last, because it is based on something deeper than just the physical. Physical attraction isn't a good judge of love. Attraction can fade, but a relationship built on a solid foundation of friendship will be much more likely to succeed.

"A friend loves at all times." – Proverbs 17:17

"Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity." 1 Timothy 4:12

3. **True love has its foundation in Jesus** – The most important thing in a relationship is the other person's feelings toward Jesus. If the person you're dating doesn't love Jesus like you do, run away from the relationship. It is never a good decision to become involved with someone that doesn't love God like you do. This will set you up for lots of heartache in the future.

"Do not be unequally yoked with unbelievers. For what partnership has righteousness with lawlessness?

Or what fellowship has light with darkness?" – 2 Cor. 6:14

The Bible gives us the best picture of what true love is. If you want to really understand what true love is, you will find it by reading your Bible. A good place to start is by reading 1 Corinthians 13, which talks a lot about what love looks like.

Updated Church Doctrinal Statement

1. We believe in the scriptures of the Old and New Testament as verbally inspired of God inerrant in the original writings, and that they are of the supreme and final authority in faith and life. (*2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Matthew 24:35*)
2. We believe in one God, eternally existing in three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (*Genesis 1:1; Deuteronomy 6:4; Matthew 3:13-17 and 28:19; John 1:1-3 and 14:25-26*)
3. We believe that in His incarnation, Jesus Christ was conceived of the Holy Spirit, was born of the Virgin Mary, and is truly God and truly man. (*Matthew 1:18-25; Luke 1:26-38; Romans 9:5; Titus 2:13*)
4. We believe that man was originally created in the image of God as a sinless being. By voluntary transgression, he fell from that sinless state by rejecting God's word and submitting to the deception of Satan. As a result, all mankind are now sinners by nature and by conduct and thereby incur not only physical death, but also that spiritual death, which is separation from God and are justly under His condemnation. (*Genesis 1:26-27, 2:16-17 and 3:6-7; Psalm 51:5; Romans 1:18-23, 3:9-18, 23 and 5:12-19*)
5. We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ died for our sins according to the Scripture as a representative and substitutionary sacrifice, that He arose victorious from the grave on the third day, that He ascended into heaven, and that His present life there for us is as High Priest and Advocate. (*Isaiah 53; Matthew 28:6; John 3:16; Acts 1:9; Romans 3:24-25; 1*
6. We believe that all the redeemed, once saved, are kept by God's power and are thus secure in Christ forever. (*John 5:24, 6:37-40, 10:27-30; Romans 5:9-10, 8:1 and 31-39; 1 Corinthians 1:4-8; Ephesians 4:30; Hebrews 7:2; 1 Peter 1:5; Jude 24*)
7. We believe that all who receive by faith the Lord Jesus Christ are born again of the Holy Spirit, and that all who believe in Him are justified on the grounds of His shed blood and thereby become children of God. True faith is always accompanied by repentance from sin. Repentance is agreeing with God that you are sinful, confessing your sins to Him, and making a conscious choice to turn from sin and pursue Christ and obedience to Him. (*John 1: 12-13 and 3:3, 5; James 1:18; 1 Peter 1:23; Ephesians 2:8-9; Luke 13:3, 5; 1 Thessalonians 1:9; Matthew 11:28-30; John 17:3; 1 John 2:3*)
8. We believe that every saved person is involved in a daily conflict – the new creation in Christ doing battle against the flesh – but adequate provision is made for victory through the power of the indwelling Holy Spirit. The spiritual struggle never completely ends. Eradication of sin is not possible in this life, but the Holy Spirit does provide for victory over sin. (*Galatians 5:16-25; Ephesians 4:22-24; Philippians 3:12; Colossians 3:9-10; 1 Peter 1:14-16; 1 John 3:3-9*)
9. We believe that God, in His own time and in His own way, will bring the world to its appropriate end. According to His promise, Jesus Christ will return personally and visibly in glory to the earth which is our blessed hope; the dead will be raised; and Christ will judge all men in righteousness. The unrighteous will be consigned to Hell, the place of everlasting punishment. The righteous in their resurrected and glorified bodies will receive their reward and will dwell forever in Heaven with the Lord. (*John 5:28-29; Acts 1:11; 1 Corinthians 15; 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17; Titus 2:13; Matthew 25:31-46; Revelation 20:11-15*)




