Over the past few years Wendy has started a new Christmas dinner tradition, her world-famous "Linebacker Lasagna." In my opinion it is the best lasagna I've ever had. It was so good this past Christmas that we had it for dinner the next day. The sauce is to die for, the cheese is scrumptious, and the meat has a nice mixture of heat and sweet. Well, I could go on and on describing how good it is but unless you taste it for yourself you just have to take my word for it.

In Psalm 34, David is inviting the nation of Israel to taste of the goodness of God. David has personally experienced God's goodness and now he wants others to experience the soul satisfying goodness of the Lord. In this Psalm we learn how to personally experience the goodness of God.

*We taste God's goodness by bringing our fears, troubles, and afflictions to him.

David wrote this Psalm, as he reflects on a time in his life when everything was being stripped away. King Saul was trying to kill him; the Philistines would not welcome him...David didn't know where to go. In his fears David sought refuge in the Lord. Psalm 34:19 says, "Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the Lord delivers him out of them all." In this life, we are going to experience many heart aches, but it is in these times where God has promised to walk with us, to protect us and ultimately to deliver us. We experience God's goodness, when like David, we take refuge in him when times are hard.

*We taste God's goodness when we bless the Lord at all times.

David says in Psalm 34:1, "I will bless the Lord at all times, his praise shall continually be in my mouth." We have a saying at Suburban, it goes like this..."God is good, all the time. All the time, God is good!" To David these were not just words, he actually lived them. It is easy to bless the Lord when everything is going great, but not so much when troubles come our way. David could bless the Lord in hard times because the hard times drove David to the Lord. It was in the hard times that David experienced how good God is. More than likely this new year will bring hard times for some of us. But know this, "God is good, all the time. All the time, God is good!"

*We taste God's goodness by continuing to live according to His Word.

One of the lies the devil has been peddling since the beginning of time is that happiness can only be experienced outside of God. He convinced Adam and Eve that disobeying God would bring them true satisfaction. He has convinced many today that following God and living according to His Word will lead to a boring and miserable life. However, in Psalm 34:12-14, David says that those who love life and desire to see many good days must... "Keep your tongue from evil and your lips from speaking deceit. Turn away from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it." It is only when we live our lives in the fear of the Lord that we experience the goodness of God. Experiencing the goodness of God can only come from a life of obedience to God.

Many of our malls have free play places for younger children to get out their energy and maybe meet new friends. There are plenty of free things you and your children can do around your home and neighborhood. God gave us all the seasons for a reason. Operation Christmas Child

This past year was a banner year for Suburban and our involvement with Operation Christmas Child Ministry. We as a church filled over 1136 gospel opportunity shoebox gifts - called this because every gift not only touches a child with joy and love from us, but with love from the very hand of God. Each child receives a booklet about "The Greatest Gift", Jesus Christ and an opportunity to learn more about God through a 12 week discipleship study entitled "The Greatest Journey". At its completion, they receive a Bible in their own language to keep and treasure as a tangible reminder of God's love. What a gift! What an easy way for us to share in such a far reaching witness for our God.

The first weekend of December, Dana and I travelled to Charlotte, NC with the area OCC team to serve in one of the 8 processing centers located in the US. On Saturday, Dec.4, the 200th million shoebox was processed and sent on its way to a child in the Ukraine. Our church helped reach that overwhelming number of gifts. We are part of a global ministry following God's instruction to "Go ye therefore and teach all nations. . ." Even though we might not physically go to distribute the shoeboxes, we are the hands and feet of God when we fill them and equip the ones who do go. Thank you for dedication and support.

We will begin to work on items to fill boxes for 2023 on Mondays at the church from 10-12 each week. Watch the bulletin for a start date or contact me. During those mornings, we'll be making different things to help if we intend to fill as many shoeboxes in 2023 as we did in 2022. Some of the supplies we will need that you can donate are: pony beads, elastic cord to make necklaces and bracelets, 12 pipe cleaners (chenille stems), large colorful or decorative buttons (flat, without shafts), and barrettes or headbands to decorate. Saturday Morning Men's Breakfast & Bible Study

January 7 & 21, 2023

The Saturday Morning Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study will meet in January on the 7th and the 21st with the study continuing in the Book of 1 Samuel. As usual, the study will feature a chapter by chapter, verse by verse, word by word, comprehensive Bible study.

Since we did not meet on December 17th, the New Year will begin with continuation of the account of the Philistine capture of the Ark of the Covenant and the curses that God placed upon the Philistines for their theft and possession of it.

They hastened to return it to the people of Israel (Chapter 6), which they did in Beth-shemesh, but there the curse of God continued as He struck down 70 men "because they looked upon (into) the ark of the LORD" (6:19), (". . . but they shall not go in to look on the holy things even for a moment, lest they die" [Numbers 4:20]).

Chapter 7 will deal with the God-led defeat of the Philistines and Israel's return to the LORD. Then Samuel built a stone memorial to the LORD. . . "called its name Ebenezer. . . and Israel delivered their territory from the hand of the Philistines . . . (and Samuel judged Israel all the days of his life" **(7:12,14 and15)**.

Chapter 8 will introduce a new paradigm in the lives of the Israelites, a move from a scattered tribal society to a central monarchy. The people demanded a king – forgetting they already had a king, GOD ALMIGHTY – despite the warnings of Samuel that concluded with: "In that day you will cry out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves, but the LORD will not answer you . . ."


Chapter 9 introduces Saul, a Benjamite of Gilbeah, who in **Chapter 10**, will be anointed and proclaimed Israel's king.

Christmas Day Guest Speaker – Dr. Danny Dwyer



With the expectant arrival of Pastor Todd and Wendy's first grandbaby, Wendy's parents, Dr. and Mrs. Danny Dwyer, made the trip from Tennessee with the hopes of being in Virginia Beach for the birth. Pastor Todd asked Dr. Dwyer to preach on Christmas morning and we were blessed with a message titled, "The "Fear Nots" of the Christmas Story." Below is a summary of Dr. Dwyer's message.

Introduction

The Biblical story of the birth of Jesus contains the words "Fear Not" given on four different occasions from the angels to the main characters. This is "heaven" telling us that the birth of the Lord Jesus, the Christmas story, is given to a chaotic world to alleviate our deepest fears. Each of the "Fear Nots" has a special significance.

I. The "Fear Not" of Delayed Blessing (Luke 1:13)

Given to Zacharias/Elizabeth. Beyond normal childbearing years. They would have a son who would play a special role in the Messianic narrative. This "Fear Not" reassures everyone that often our hopes are not denied but delayed. Some things are matters of God's timing. So, don't give up. God has not forgotten you.

II. The "Fear Not" of Unqualified Trust (Luke 1:30)

Given to Mary. Lots of questions from her about "How". The answer was that "with God all things are possible." She may not fully understand, but God is able when she was not. This "Fear Not" means that some things require us to trust God even when we don't see how things can work out.

III. The "Fear Not" of Personified Obedience (Matthew 1:18-25)

Given to Joseph. His plans for marriage were totally demolished when Mary was "found to be with child". His name is specifically used four times. The angel calls his name specifically. This "Fear Not" means that God's truth needs to be taken personally. It is for me. He knows my name (and yours).

IV. The "Fear Not" of Ultimate Purpose (Luke 2:8-17)

Given to the shepherds. Tending sheep that would probably be used for sacrifices. To them was given the truth that the Savior of the world had been born. The Lord had something greater intended for them to know. This "Fear Not" means that there is a greater purpose for our lives and what we do. That is that there is an ultimate purpose for everyone ("the world"). That purpose is to give "Glory to God in the highest" and have His "peace."

Thank you, Dad, for sending me the summary and allowing me to share it with our church family. I love you! ~Wendy


