From the Pastor's Desk: When I Am Afraid! Psalm 56:3

"When I am afraid, I put my trust in you. In God, whose word I praise, in God, I trust; I shall not be afraid." (Psalm 56:3,4)

David penned these words as he reflected on a time when his life was in constant danger. David fled Israel and Saul, thinking he might find refuge among the Philistines. However, instead of finding safety, he is filled with fear when Achish, king of Gath, doesn't provide David with the warm welcome he was seeking. David was afraid! David realized that his life was at risk. If we were in David's shoes, we also would have been afraid.

We have all experienced things in this life that have caused us to be afraid. Whenever we believe that something threatens our safety or well-being, the natural human response is fear. Fear is a human reality we all experience. As Christians it is God's will for us not to live in fear (2 Timothy 1:7). Fear keeps us from trusting, and obeying God. Just like fear kept the Israelites from trusting and obeying God when they refused to enter the promised land, because there were giants in the land. Fear has a way of disorienting and distorting reality. Fear tells us that whatever is threatening our well-being is invincible and all powerful. But the word of God is the ultimate source of reality, and it tells us that only our God is eternal and all powerful.

Thankfully, in Psalm 56, David shows us how to successfully fight fear! When David was afraid, he deliberately chose to trust in God! David made a conscious choice not to focus on the source of his fear, but to focus on the promises of God's Word. God had promised David that he would one day be king of Israel. David knew that God was faithful and keeps his promises. Even though David's life was threatened by powerful forces he knew that God and his powerful promises we're greater. David walked by faith and not by sight.

None of us know what tomorrow holds... what potential sources of fear are just around the corner. But we do know **WHO** holds tomorrow! In order to overcome the fear in our lives, we need to fill our hearts with the powerful promises of God's word. Here are a few promises that were shared during a recent midweek power.

Isaiah 41:10, "Fear not for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

Psalm 23:4, "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, because you are with me; your rod and your staff they comfort me."

Romans 8:28, "And we know that for those who love God, all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose."

Philippians 1:6, "And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ."

Proverbs 3:5 & 6, "Trust in the lord, with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways, acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

Romans 8:31 & 32, "If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?"

The next time, fear comes knocking at your door, be sure to answer it with the powerful, fear-silencing promises of God's Word!



Men's Ministry

The Saturday Morning Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study continues to meet on the first and third Saturdays of each month. In August, it will meet on the 5^{th} and 19^{th} .

Last month's study in I Samuel concluded Chapter 19 and introduced Chapter 20. It involved Saul's jealous anger against David because of his growing popularity with the people and with Saul's continued attempts to kill him.



This month, on August 5th, the study will continue in Chapter 20 in which Saul's son, Jonathan, will confirm his loyalty to David by revealing his father's plans to kill him and helping him escape. Saul's anger was then directed toward Jonathan and he told him, "For as long as (David) lives on earth, neither you nor your kingdom shall be established" (20:31). In his anger, Saul then hurled his spear at him. Nevertheless, Jonathan continued to aid David.

On August 19th the study will look at Chapter 21 which is centered on David's escape from Saul and his visit to the shrine at Nob (north of Jerusalem) where its priest, Ahimelech, extended hospitality to him and gave him Goliath's sword for his protection. (When Saul learned of that, he had Nob's priest killed, 85 of them. That will be studied in Chapter 22) David then fled to Gath (in Philistia, on its border with Judah) where he feared its king and pretended to be insane. From there, he escaped to the cave of Adullam in Judah's hill country. Those are fascinating accounts.

The Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study is an outstanding opportunity for the study of God's Word, prayer, and fellowship for men of all ages; church members and non-members. The breakfast and the Bible study are open to all men, and all are invited to enjoy a good, homemade breakfast of eggs (scramble and fried), sausage, corned beef hash, pancakes, waffles, biscuits, grits, sausage gravy, fruit, orange juice, and coffee. Come and enjoy good fellowship, and the Good News found in God's Word. It all begins at 8:00 AM and concludes around 9:30, or so.

Suburban Children's Church News



















